Title: Parliament Road

Purpose of the Report: To consider laying a footpath to improve the appearance

of a grassed area.

### Background

Lea Park Resident's Association has been working hard to improve the visual appearance of the whole estate. One area of concern is Parliament Road where although there is a footpath, pedestrians still choose to cut the corner and walk across the grassed area. The amount of foot traffic has worn away the grass and does not add to the visual appearance of the area.



# **Proposal**

The option to plant the area has been discussed but may still not deter people taking this "shortcut". The conclusion therefore is that since pedestrians have created this path then it would be best to actually install one.

The cost to install a tarmac path with all necessary works is £3000.

The suggestion is that the cost of the path could be funded from some of the receipt received from the sale of the land at Lenthall Green, |(£30,000). Thus one area of the estate benefiting another.
