Title: Health and Safety Visit Outcome

Purpose of the Report

1. To note the outcomes of the Health & Safety visit by Ellis Whittam on Friday 15 February 2019.

Background

- 2. A new Health & Safety Consultant, Steve Wood, carried out his first annual General Risk Assessment Inspection & full Health & Safety Audit at the Town Hall & Depot on 15 February 2019 as part of our three year contract with Ellis Whittam. Other sites will be visited at the second visit in October 2019.
- 3. A full 102 page report was received at the end of February with an overall score of 74%.
- **4.** The report identified that 181 of 216 risk areas are all in order, and raised 57 observations in the 35 risk areas identified as needing further work.
- **5.** All the observations are "medium risk" which means action is suggested within 3 months.
- **6.** There are zero critical (action within 48 hours), zero high (action in 7 days) and zero low (action in 6 months).
- **7.** The Town Clerk, Asset Manager and Office Administration Manager have met to discuss the report in detail and the 57 observations in particular.
- **8.** It appears that a combination of:
 - a. A new assessor from Ellis Whittam
 - b. An updated computerised compliance audit system, with less flexibility
 - c. A new Health and Safety Contract
 - d. A new Office Administration Manager.

has meant that the report is questionable in some areas.

- **9.** Some of the observations relate to areas that were reported to be all OK in the February 2018 / October 2018 reports to the Policy & Resources Committee and have possibly been erroneously rolled forward without update. Procedural evidence for these will be re-presented.
- **10.** Some of the observations relate to items that were not discussed in the visit / areas not visited and can be resolved by providing procedural evidence that wasn't requested.
- **11.** Some of the observations are clear areas where improvement in risk management will be beneficial.
- 12. All remedial action required will be executed by 29 May 2019.

Resource Appraisal

13. There may be a cost to undertake the remedial works/actions identified but these will be reported to Council if they cannot be undertaken within current budgets.
