### Purpose of Report

1. To provide background on the re-adoption of the General Power of Competence

### Background

2. The Localism Act 2011 introduced a General Power of Competence for Town and Parish Councils, subject to certain conditions being met.
3. A separate briefing paper from the DCLG: "A briefing paper on the General Power of Competence April 2012" describing the power is attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
4. The Town Council made the required formal resolution at the Annual Meeting of the Council on 19 May 2015.
5. The law requires that the criteria for holding the General Power of Competence be checked and that a formal resolution be made to that effect at each new administration.

### Action Required

6. To note the briefing paper on the General Power of Competence as attached at Appendix 1 of this report.
7. To note that the conditions are satisfied as follows:
  - Thame Town Council has 16 out of 16 Councillors elected
  - The Town Clerk holds the CiLCA qualification
  - The Town Clerk has passed the 2012 CiLCA module on the General Power of Competence
8. To resolve that the Council meets the criteria for eligibility for the General Power of Competence relating to the electoral mandate and relevant training of the Town Clerk.
