Title: Report - External Organisations

Date: Tuesday 1 November 2022

a) Barns Centre (Cllrs Deacock and Dodds)

Nothing received at 31/10/2022

b) Citizens Advice (Cllr Austin)

There are no particular issues to report for Thame other than an expected increased demand, mainly around cost of living issues and energy crisis. Drop-in on Tuesdays is usually very busy, less so on Thursdays. There are two new advisers currently training. Also there is one paid adviser in place on a fixed term contract, funded by OCC as part of its response to the CoL crisis. Her focus will be debt and money advice.

c) Health Hub (including Community Hub Pilot) (Cllrs Champken-Woods and Richards)

Discussions between Thame Health Centre consortium (Rycote & Unity GP Practices) and Montpellier/Hallam Land are currently suspended as agreement could not be reached on a plan for a new Health Centre. Current space utilisation issues are so acute that practices are having to employ remote working solutions as not all staff can be accommodated in the Thame Health Centre building all of the time. The practices continue to explore options to acquire more space to provide services for a growing population. Ideally this would take the form of a new health centre but dialogue has also been opened with Buckinghamshire Healthcare Trust about the possibility of utilising premises on the existing Community Hospital site. BHT are currently undertaking a space utilisation review and a response is awaited.

d) NALC (Cllr Dyer)

e) Red Kite Family Centre (Cllr Emery)

Session attendance

Overall attendance has been at 102% of capacity. The Stay and Play sessions (2 in Thame and 1 in Chinnor) remain the most popular with attendance normally being over 100%. We are at around 50% of people booking in advance and 50% drop-ins since pandemic restrictions have lifted, hence the over subscription. We have yet to hit the same levels of attendance for the stay and plays that we had pre-covid but this appears to be welcomed by the families who do attend. In response to the cost-of-living crisis, we have opened up our lunch club to low-income families as well as young parents and now have now got a regular group of attendees. We regret that following the graduation of our 'Bump Café' attendees before summer, we have been unable to fill the group this term so we are re-looking at the viability of this service.

Community Engagement

We have started our Cinema sessions at the Players theatre again. Our first showing helped to raise just over £165 and we have another showing soon. We have taken part in the Thame Art Crawl this month where we hosted a pop-up marquee welcoming around 150 people with arts and crafts activities for all ages. Initial donations have raised £135 with further donations coming soon from the Silent Auction and Raffle. Over the summer, our Holiday Club helped to raise just under £750.
