# a) Cuttle Brook Management Committee (Cllr Jones)

The following have taken place since the last report:

- Re-planting of trees in the Cox's Wood felled areas (ash dieback clearance)
- Powerline clearance. There were a lot of trees felled, including some diseased ash at our request. Some of the felled material is earmarked for brook enhancement work see later
- Regular postings on our new Instagram account, courtesy of Daisy Edinburgh a DofE student
- A pollution incident caused by Thames Water contractors working in Coombe Hill Crescent which CBCV followed up with the Environment Agency (absolutely useless!) and with TW (who took it very seriously, investigated and kept Mike Furness in the loop, all of which was quite impressive)
- CBCV have started working with River Thame Conservation Trust on further brook enhancements through the reserve (including Rycote Meadow). The first stage is to complete a 'topographical' survey of the brook bed so that the best locations for enhancement works can be identified. The work is on hold because of freezing conditions and also very high water levels, both of which make it unsafe to work in the brook. It is hoped to re-commence the survey next week and complete it by the end of February.
- Thame Belles WI gave a donation towards the tree planting (c.£100) and five 'belles' turned out to help plant.

## c) Thame Carnival Committee (Cllr Emery)

This years annual Carnival Parade on 17th June 2023 does not have a "theme" so all parade entries can dress up, create a float or walk with a community group whatever costume or outfit you'd like. This is so that we hopefully make the parade bigger and better than it has been for the last few years.

Our new logo will be launched in the next couple of weeks. This has been designed again by last year's creator of the "Queens Platinum Jubilee" logo, Cassie Hooper from Buckinghamshire New University, Aylesbury Campus. We are very pleased that Cassie has decided to offer her support again this year.

Over the last couple of months, we have invited local charities to be considered as our Charities of choice to benefit from the funds we raise. #### d) Thame Football Partnership (TFP) (Cllr Dyer)

At the Board Meeting in early December it was reported that energy costs had tripled from £ 12k to £36k per annum, resulting in a small loss on the first half-year's trading. They are investigating the possibility of installing PV's and considering whether they might need to increase income through membership fees and bar prices.

All activities remain buoyant and the pitches have recovered from the Autumn drought and are in good condition. After a poor start to the season Thame United have now found some form and are slowly moving up the league table.

TFP have also been invited to take part in the FA Club Programme, a scheme which recognises clubs that excel against a range of key criteria including physical infrastructure, community links and senior/junior structure. Thame are one of just twelve clubs, from 84, in the Southern League to have been selected. Participation in the scheme enables access to specialist consultant support in key areas, plus improved access to grants and funding streams. They have, of course, accepted and are currently completing a self-assessment SWOT analysis as the first stage.

# e) Twinning Association (CIIr Emery)

Membership remains strong.

Over the winter months the Association have organised a few fundraising and social events. Our most successful was quiz night at the Town Hall in November that was hosted by Sue Boyle. We were delighted to support and give a donation to her continuing fund-raising efforts for the Stroke Association.

We have not held any official meetings for the past few months. The Thame and Montesson Associations have agreed that our Annual Twinning exchange week-end will be 12th to 14th May 2023. As soon as the itinerary has been finalised it will be shared.

## k) Thame Museum Trust (Clirs Cowell & Emery)

Thame Museum opens after the Christmas break on 4th February. We open with a brand new exhibition "Printastic" a celebration of the fantastic print work created by the Art students of Lord Williams School 2022. Communicating a wide variety pf themes.

The recruitment Open Day on the 27th and 28th January was very successful. A report will be made available at next Trustees meeting.
