- 5. Dispensations enable the Council to discuss business which would otherwise be precluded by Members having particular interests.
- 6. The policy document also includes a list of agreed "General Dispensations" that the Town Council has granted.
- 7. Members are welcome to make suggestions for changes.

### **Granted Dispensations**

- 8. It is a legal restriction that any granted dispensations expire on a new administration and therefore where still relevant, now need to be renewed or removed:
  - (a) Thame Museum (& projects, including Thame Remembers) (granted / updated 2022) Cllrs Bretherton, Cowell, Dite, Dodds, Dyer, Emery
  - (b) Moorend Lane Farm (granted 2017) Cllr Cowell
  - (c) Thame Skate Park (granted 2015) Cllr Cowell
  - (d) Thame Youth Projects Group (granted 20109) Cllrs Cowell, Emery, Fickling
  - (e) Thame Shed (granted 2021) Cllrs Dite & Wyse
- 9. If a Member seeks a new Dispensation, this should be done via the Town Clerk as per the policy.
