### **Purpose of the Report**

1. To propose Christmas events and activities throughout December 2023

# Background

- 2. This report outlines our suggested programme for December 2023, taking into consideration:
  - Light Switch-On
  - Continuing to run/promote additional events through December in partnership with other organisations, but avoiding the 'deadtime' of Sunday afternoons.
  - Engaging more help and support from councillors in staffing.
  - Increase advertisements in Christmas booklet for extra revenue.
  - An expanded Street Food Market to increase revenue.

# Proposal

- 3. To run one main Light Switch-On event on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> December, that launches the rest of the month's community events and activities. This approach will draw people to shop in Thame, and therefore help businesses during the season. The events should also provide extra Christmas cheer, kind hearts and community spirit.
- 4. This year we are looking to have a snowman theme, which will motif into our promotional print, and within activities throughout the month.

- 5. Run alongside the events above will be competitions and activities including, but not limited to:
  - Sally Evans craft fairs (2<sup>nd</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Dec)
  - Senior Citizens Tea Party (8<sup>th</sup> Dec)
  - Mynt Image craft fair (9<sup>th</sup> Dec)
  - Snowman art installation at the Library that engages schools and community groups (hosted by the Library and supported by Windles);
  - Shop window display competitions to win voucher prizes donated by businesses.
  - Find the snowman competition within Town Centre
  - Letter to Santa to support the work of the Red Kite Family Centre.
  - Selfie-station.

### Promotion

6. A booklet containing all the details of our events in December, as well as all other community events we can gather before our print deadline, will be printed, and distributed to each home in Thame prior to 1st December. The events will also be promoted through 'Thame Town Council' Facebook, Instagram and Twitter pages.
