


1. How frequently do you think P&E should meet from May 2024?

Since September 2023, P&E has been meeting 4-5 weekly. Previously it was 3-weekly. The approved schedule up to May 2024 is 4-weekly.






2. Which aspects of the officer report do you find helpful?





Applications of a certain size / scale (such as any application for 1 or more new dwellings)


Any application where the consultation period cannot be extended to after the P&E meeting.

10. What do you think is working / has worked well about CAAC to date?

- They do know a lot of 'stuff' about Thame and do notice things that are out of kilter with the town's history
- I write with limited experience of CAAC input. An extra check on conservation area changes seems like a good thing if there are willing participants.
- The CAAC considers the changes to Thame which will make the town a less attractive place to live in

- not enough expertise, comments biased by opinions rather than facts


12. Do you have any ideas for how CAAC could be improved or changed?
