

What is Community Speedwatch

- Community Speedwatch is a community operated initiative designed to enable trained volunteers to help Thames Valley Police monitor vehicles speeding in areas of concern.
- Thame Town Council has been working alongside Thames Valley Police and local communities to promote road safety, help reduce speed and educate drivers.
- Once trained the volunteers will:
 - 1.Participate in a Speedwatch Campaign in a specific area as approved on the Thames Valley Police Online dashboard.
 - 2.Report all speeding vehicles to Thames Valley Police
 - 3.Thames Valley Police send advisory letters to the owners of all vehicles registered as speeding.
 - 4.Thames Valley Police provide updates on total number of letters sent within all areas in the Thames Valley where Community Speedwatch campaigns are in place.

Speedwatch is not an enforcement; it is about raising awareness to speeding drivers.

How it works:

- Trained volunteers confirm availability to volunteer for Speedwatch campaigns
- A minimum of 4 volunteers are required for each Speedwatch campaign
- The Group Coordinator is responsible for all the necessary equipment and administration
- Suggested monitoring location are sent to Thames Valley Police CSW Online by the Group Coordinator for approval
- Trained volunteers will verify and record vehicle registration numbers of offending vehicles
- Offending vehicle details are added to Thames Valley Police CSW Online by the Group Coordinator
- Thames Valley Police will validate the vehicle registration numbers against owners address
- Thames Valley Police send letters to offenders
- Persistent offenders will be issued with a fine by Thames Valley Police

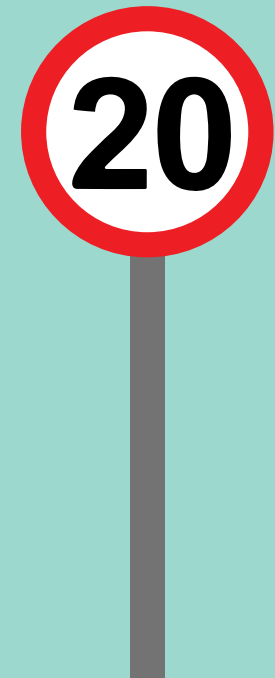

REGISTRATION AND ASSESSMENT

You will receive instructions from Thames Valley Police on how to register for the online assessment



COMPLETION OF ASSESSMENT

Once the Town Council's Group Coordinator receives confirmation you have passed your assessment, they will arrange for you to attend on-site training



ON SITE TRAINING

The Group Coordinator will schedule dates and locations for Speedwatch campaigns which new volunteers can attend



SPEEDWATCH CAMPAIGNS

Once volunteers are fully trained, they will be able to conduct scheduled Speedwatch Campaigns alongside 3-4 others
